THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION (CONVENTION ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN
ENDANGERED SPECIES OF WILD FAUNA AND FLORA (CITES)) (IMPLEMENTATION)
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2023

Citation

1. The Wildlife Conservation (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (Cites)) (Implementation) (Amendment) Regulations, 2023 and shall be read as one with the Wildlife Conservation (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (Cites)) (Implementation) Regulations, 2018 hereinafter referred to as the “principal Regulations”.

Amendment
of regulation 2

2. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 2, by –

(a) deleting subregulation (2) and substituting for it the following:

“(2) The CITES appendices species shall be approved from time to time by the Conference of the Parties.”
and

(b) adding immediately after subregulation (2) the following:

“(3) The approved CITES appendices shall be as set out in the Fifth Schedule.”.

Amendment
of regulation 3

3. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 3 by adding in the appropriate alphabetical order the following definitions:

- “extract” means any substance obtained directly from plant material by physical or chemical means regardless of the manufacturing process. An extract may either be solid like crystals, resin, fine or coarse particles or semi-solid like gums, waxes or liquid like solutions, tinctures, oil and essential oils;
- “finished musical instruments” means a musical instrument as referenced by the Harmonized System of the World Customs Organization, Chapter 92; musical instruments, parts and accessories of such articles, that is ready to play or needs only the installation of parts to make it playable. This term includes antique instruments as defined by the Harmonized System codes 97.05 and 97.06, Works of art, collectors' pieces and antiques;
- “finished musical instrument accessories” means a musical instrument accessory (as referenced by the Harmonized System of the World Customs Organization, Chapter 92; musical instruments, parts and accessories of such articles that is separate from the musical instrument, and is specifically designed or shaped to be used explicitly in association with an instrument, and that requires no further modification to be used;
- “finished musical instrument parts” means a part as referenced by the Harmonized System of the World Customs Organization, Chapter 92, musical instruments, parts and accessories of such articles of a musical instrument that is ready to install and is specifically designed and shaped to be used explicitly in association with the instrument to make it playable;
- “finished products packaged and ready for retail trade” means products, shipped singly or in bulk, requiring no further processing, packaged, labelled for final use or the retail trade in a state fit for being sold to or used by the general public;

- “powder” means a dry, solid substance in the form of fine or coarse particles;
- “shipment” means cargo transported under the terms of a single bill of lading or air waybill, irrespective of the quantity or number of containers or packages or pieces worn, carried or included in personal baggage;
- “ten kg per shipment” means the weight of wood of each individual annotated species of genus *Dalbergia* or *Guibourtia* present in the items in the shipment. The 10 kg limit is to be assessed only against the individual weights of the portions of wood of each individual annotated species contained in each item of the shipment, and not against the total weight of the shipment. The total weights present of each individual annotated species are considered individually to determine whether a CITES permit or certificate is required for each individual annotated species, and weights of different individual annotated species are not added together for this purpose;
- “transformed wood” as defined by Harmonized System code 44.09: Wood including strips, friezes for parquet flooring, not assembled, continuously shaped tongued, grooved, rebated, chamfered, V-jointed, beaded, moulded, rounded or the like, along any of its edges, ends or faces, whether or not planed, sanded or end-jointed;
- “woodchips” means wood that has been reduced to small pieces;”

Addition of Fifth
Schedule

4. The principal Regulations are amended by adding immediately after the Fourth Schedule the following:

FIFTH SCHEDULE

(Made under regulation 2(3))

CITES APPENDICES I, II AND III

Species included in these Appendices are referred to:

- a) by the name of the species; or
- b) as being all of the species included in a higher taxon or designated part thereof.

The abbreviation “spp.” is used to denote all species of a higher taxon. Other references to taxa higher than species are for the purposes of information or classification only. The common names included after the scientific names of families are for reference only. They are intended to indicate the species within the family concerned that are included in the Appendices. In most cases this is not all of the species within the family.

The following abbreviations are used for plant taxa below the level of species:

- a) “ssp.” is used to denote subspecies; and
- b) “var(s).” is used to denote variety (varieties).

As none of the species or higher taxa of FLORA included in Appendix I is

annotated to the effect that its hybrids shall be treated in accordance with the provisions of Article III of the Convention, this means that artificially propagated hybrids produced from one or more of these species or taxa may be traded with a certificate of artificial propagation, and that seeds and pollen (including pollinia), cut flowers, seedling or tissue cultures obtained *in vitro*, transported in sterile containers of these hybrids are not subject to the provisions of the Convention.

The names of the countries in parentheses placed against the names of species in Appendix III are those of the Parties submitting these species for inclusion in this Appendix.

When a species is included in Appendix I, II or III, the whole, live or dead, animal or plant is always included. In addition, all parts and derivatives thereof are also included in the same Appendix unless, for animal species listed in Appendix III and plant species listed in Appendix II or III, the species is annotated with the symbol # followed by a number to indicate that only specific parts and derivatives are included. The symbol # followed by a number placed against the name of a species or higher taxon included in Appendix II or III refers to a footnote that indicates the parts or derivatives of animals or plants that are designated as 'specimens' subject to the provisions of the Convention in accordance with Article I, paragraph (b), subparagraph (ii) or (iii).

^{A3} For the exclusive purpose of allowing international trade in fibre from vicuñas (*Vicugna vicugna*) and their derivative products, only if the fibre comes from the shearing of live vicuñas. Trade in products derived from the fibre may only take place in accordance with the following provisions:

- (a) Any person or entity processing vicuña fibre to manufacture cloth and garments must request authorization from the relevant authorities of the country of origin (Countries of origin: The countries where the species occurs, that is, Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Ecuador and Peru) to use the "vicuña country of origin" wording, mark or logo adopted by the range States of the species that are signatories to the Convention for the Conservation and Management of the Vicuña.
- (b) Marketed cloth or garments must be marked or identified in accordance with the following provisions:
 - I. For international trade in cloth made from live-sheared vicuña fibre, whether the cloth was produced within or outside of the range States of the species, the wording, mark or logo must be used so that the country of origin can be

identified. The VICUÑA [COUNTRY OF ORIGIN] wording, mark or logo has the format as detailed below:



This wording, mark or logo must appear on the reverse side of the cloth. In addition, the selvages of the cloth must bear the words VICUÑA [COUNTRY OF ORIGIN].

- ii) For international trade in garments made from live-sheared vicuña fibre, whether the garments were produced within or outside of the range States of the species, the wording, mark or logo indicated in paragraph b) i) must be used. This wording, mark or logo must appear on a label on the garment itself. If the garments are produced outside of the country of origin, the name of the country where the garment was produced should also be indicated, in addition to the wording, mark or logo referred to in paragraph b) i).
- (c) For international trade in handicraft products made from live-sheared vicuña fibre produced within the range States of the species, the VICUÑA [COUNTRY OF ORIGIN] - ARTESANÍA wording, mark or logo must be used as detailed below:



- (d) If live-sheared vicuña fibre from various countries of origin is used for the production of cloth and garments, the wording, mark or logo of each of the countries of origin of the fibre must be indicated, as detailed in paragraphs b) i) and ii).
- (e) All other specimens shall be deemed to be specimens of species listed in Appendix I and the trade in them shall be regulated accordingly.
