Citation

1. This Notice may be cited as the Bank of Tanzania (Issuance of Re-printed Banknotes of 2010 Series) Notice, 2024.

2.-(1) In the exercise of the powers conferred upon the Bank of Tanzania by sections 26 and 27(2) of the Bank of Tanzania Act, the Bank notifies the public that with effect from the date of coming into operation of this Notice it has issued into circulation the re-printed banknotes in denominations of One Thousand, Two Thousand, Five Thousand and Ten Thousand of 2010 Series.

(2) The existing banknotes in circulation of One Thousand, Two Thousand, Five Thousand and Ten Thousand denominations of 2010 Series shall remain the legal tender and continue circulating concurrently with the re-printed banknotes.

3. The re-printed banknotes in the denominations of One Thousand, Two Thousand, Five Thousand and Ten Thousand shall have the same

characteristics of 2010 Series with the signatures of the Minister for Finance and the Governor of the Bank of Tanzania as stipulated in the Schedule.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE RE-PRINTED BANKNOTES OF 2010 SERIES

SIDE OF A NOTE	A: COMMON CHARACTERISTICS FOR ALL BANKNOTES
OBVERSE (FRONT SIDE)	1. The upper off-center depicts the Coat of Arms of the United Republic of Tanzania.
	2. On the top-center of the banknote and above the main motif are the legible wordings “BENKI KUU YA TANZANIA” and the promissory clause of the respective denomination.
	3. Below the main motifs are the respective facsimile signatures of Mwigulu Lameck Nchemba Madelu, the Minister for Finance and Emmanuel Mpawe Tutuba, the Governor of the Bank of Tanzania.
	4. The unprinted area on the left of the banknote contains a watermark and a highlight revealing the portrait of Mwalimu Julius Kambarage Nyerere and the respective denomination value, when held to the light.
	5. The banknote carries two identical serial numbers in novel format; one horizontally at the lower left quadrant and vertically at the right edge of the banknote. Each serial number has two alphabetical prefixes and seven numerals.
	6. A perfect see-through registering back to front, the respective denomination figure when held to the light below the top left denomination value.
	7. Phosphorescent block visible under UV light on the left side of the Main motif revealing denomination figure at the top of the band and at the bottom the prefix letters of the currency reading “TZS” in the banknotes of 2000, 5000 and 10000; while for 1000 banknote, phosphorescent block appears on the immediate left side of the main motif revealing the denomination value.
	8. Micro text lines, both flat and in relief.
	9. Latent image in which the denomination value appears in shadow and turns lighter when the banknote is tilted.
	10. A windowed security thread (Rolling Star) with moving image in the banknotes of 2000, 5000 and 10000.
	11. The print for the main motif, the Coat of Arms, denominational figures, the legible wordings “BENKI KUU YA TANZANIA”, micro-letterings and the denominational sign for the blind are in intaglio giving the banknote a special tactile feeling.
	12. Random distributed visible fibres in two colours red and blue visible in natural light and invisible fibres in three colours red, blue and green visible under UV light.
REVERSE (BACK SIDE)	1. Each denomination has a dedicated Vignette.
	2. The legible wordings “BANK OF TANZANIA” is printed on the top left side of the banknote.

	3. Florescent block at the centre of the banknote revealing two colours when viewed under UV light in banknotes of 2000, 5000 and 10000.
	4. The denomination figures are printed at both the top right and the bottom left corners of the banknotes.
	5. The wordings for respective denominations are in English and are printed in bold capital letters at the bottom right-hand side of the banknotes.
	6. An optical variable magnetic ink feature in rolling star bar effect called Spark present at the upper off-center featuring a giraffe from head to neck and changes colour from gold to green when tilted in the banknotes of 2000, 5000 and 10000.
	7. Randomly distributed visible fibres in two colours red and blue visible in natural light and invisible fibres in three colours red, blue and green visible under UV light.
A: SPECIFIC CHARACTERISTICS	
TZS 1000 Size: 125 x 65mm Colour: Blue Theme: Natural Resources and Agriculture	
OBVERSE (FRONT SIDE)	1. A tactile main motif of the official portrait of Mwalimu Julius Kambarage Nyerere at the middle right half of the banknote.
	2. Tactile denomination sign for the blind; presented as two thick short line running parallel to each other placed at the bottom left corner.
	3. Lift twin - two images, the denomination value 1000 and a giraffe's head appear when the banknote is viewed horizontally at eye level.
	4. A tactile vignette of the State House, coffee and cloves plants from the center towards the left of the banknote.
	5. A 2mm cleartext security thread on the right side - the thread is incorporated into the paper bearing the following repeating text, "BOT 2023", which can be clearly seen when the banknote is viewed against the natural light.
	6. A diamond-shaped gemini feature positioned slightly off-center at the top, with a giraffe head inside the diamond.
	7. Iridescent stripe with repeated number 1000 at the centre of the banknote.
TZS 2000 Size: 130 x 66mm Colour: Brown Theme: Tourism and Culture	
OBVERSE (FRONT SIDE)	1. A tactile main motif of the head of a Lion in intaglio print at the middle of the right half of the banknote.
	2. Tactile denomination sign for the blind; presented as one thick short line forming an inverted V- like shape placed at the bottom left corner.
	3. A thin windowed security thread of 4.0 mm which shows a movement of colour change when tilting the banknote, the curved lines (waves) appear, moving from right to left and backwards. While doing so, the colour of the thread changes from gold to green. When holding the banknote against the natural light, in the security thread the words "BOT 2000" appear.
REVERSE (BACK SIDE)	1. A tactile vignette of the Zanzibar Old Fort running from the centre towards the left of the banknote.

	2. Tactile printing of the Zanzibar chest at the centre of the banknote, besides the Old Fort.
	3. A feature of Spark in golden colour which changes to green and back to gold with a rolling bar effect.
TZS 5000 Size: 135 x 67mm Colour: Violet Theme: Mining and Industry	
OBVERSE (FRONT SIDE)	1. A tactile main motif of the head of a Rhinoceros at the middle of the right half of the banknote.
	2. A feature called Spark in golden colour which changes to green and back to gold with a rolling bar effect.
	3. Tactile denomination sign for the blind; presented as two sets of twin thick short lines forming two inverted V- like shapes, placed at the bottom left corner.
	4. There is a thin windowed security thread of 4.5mm which shows a movement of colour change. When tilting the banknote, the curved lines (waves) appear, moving from right to left and backwards. While doing so, the colour of the thread changes from blue to violet. When holding the banknote against the light, in the security thread the words "BOT 5000" appear.
REVERSE (BACK SIDE)	1. A tactile vignette of the Ashanti Goldmine located at the centre of the banknote.
	2. A feature of Spark in golden colour which changes to green and back again to gold with a rolling bar effect.

TZS 10000 Size: 140 x 68mm Colour: Red Theme: Finance and Services	
OBVERSE (FRONT SIDE)	1. A tactile main motif of the head of the Elephant at the middle of the right half of the banknote.
	2. Tactile denomination sign for the blind; presented as three sets of twin thick short lines forming three inverted V- like shapes, placed at the bottom left hand side corner.
	3. There is a thin windowed security thread of 4.5mm which shows a movement of colour change. When tilting the banknote, the curved lines (waves) appear, moving from right to left and backwards. While doing so, the colour of the thread changes from magenta to green. When holding the bank note against the light, in the security thread the words "BOT 10000" appear.
REVERSE (BACK SIDE)	1. A tactile vignette showing the Bank of Tanzania Sub Head Quarter in Dar es Salaam, covering the left half of the banknote.
	2. A feature of Spark in golden colour which changes to green and back to gold with a rolling bar effect.
