Refuelling Station along Sam Nujoma Road)
(Construction Approval) Notice, 2023.
- Interpretation 2. In this Notice, unless the context otherwise
requires-
“Applicant” means TAQA Dalbit (T) Limited of P. O.
Box 76908 Dar es Salaam;
“Authority” means the Energy and Water Utilities
Regulatory Authority established under the
Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority
Act; and
“Construction Approval” means an approval issued by
the Authority according to Section 128(1) of the
Petroleum Act.

- Granting of a
Construction
Approval 3.The applicant is hereby granted Construction
Approval to construct a natural gas refuelling station at
Plot No. 2005/5/1/3, Block C, Ubungo located along Sam
Nujoma Road, Dar es Salaam subject to the following
conditions:
(a) Construction shall not commence until the
applicant has obtained Environmental Impact
Assessment Certificate from relevant
authority;

- (b) comply with the approved design, technical specifications, processes (installation, construction, welding, testing and commissioning), demarcated right of way and applicable laws;
- (c) ensure the station or other related facilities are constructed following comprehensive written specifications, standards issued by the Tanzania Bureau of Standards and applicable laws;
- (d) ensure that construction inspection requirements for refuelling stations or other related facilities are adequate to assure compliance with the material, construction, welding, assembly, and testing requirements of the standards issued by the Tanzania Bureau of Standards;
- (e) ensure that, there are minimal inconveniences to the residents around the station and the safety of the public is given prime consideration. In case blasting is involved, it should be done in accordance with the governing regulations and should be performed by competent and qualified personnel and be performed to provide adequate protection to the general public, livestock, wildlife, buildings, telephone, power lines, underground structures and any other property in the proximity of the blasting;
- (f) ensure that, in grading the site, every effort should be made to minimize damage to the land, and prevent abnormal drainage and erosive conditions. The land is to be restored to as nearly original condition as is practical;
- (g) observe environmental, health and safety standards as required by the applicable laws. Health and safety of all personnel and equipment should be taken into account and ensure the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) all the time including head

- hat, safety glasses, safety boots, and use of fire extinguisher; and
- (h) ensure all existing utilities whether regulated by the Authority or not are protected from damage and formally communicate with operators of such utilities to request their presence on-site during project execution.

Expiry of a
Construction
Approval

4. The Construction Approval shall automatically expire or cease to have effect if such construction fails to take effect within twenty-four months from the date of issue.
